The minimum G.C.C. grade point average after two years for students who wish to matriculate in the baccalaureate degree programs in Teacher Certification is 3.0, Business Administration and Accounting (2.5 in specified prerequisite courses), Criminal Justice is 2.5, International Business (3.0 in specified prerequisite courses) and Social Work is a 3.0. The minimum grade-point-average requirement for all other degree programs included in this agreement is 2.50. The Joint Admissions agreement will be null and void if the participant does not maintain the minimum grade point average at G.C.C.

Participants in this cooperative degree program are not required to file an application for admission to Brockport.

However, students who anticipate enrolling at SUNY Brockport under the auspices of this agreement must file a Notice of Intent to Enroll with the Office of Admissions at SUNY Brockport prior to beginning their studies at Brockport. For the summer and fall terms, the Notice of Intent must be on file by April 1; for the spring term it must be on file by November 15. All Joint Admissions students matriculated in degree programs at Genesee Community College will be sent a copy of the Intent to Enroll form at the beginning of their final semester of study at Genesee Community College.

No tuition deposit will be required of students who plan to continue their studies at SUNY Brockport. However, students who wish to reside in campus residence halls will be required to submit a \$50 deposit fee by May 1 for the fall semester and December 1 for the spring semester.

However, students who anticipate enrolling at SUNY Buffalo under the auspices of this agreement must file a Notice of Intent to Enroll with the Office of Admissions at SUNY Buffalo prior to beginning their studies at SUNY Buffalo. For the summer and fall terms, the Notice of Intent must be on file by February 1; for the spring term it must be on file by October 15. All Joint Admissions/Cooperative Degree students matriculated in degree programs at Genesee Community College will be sent a copy of the Intent to Enroll form at the beginning of their final semester of study at Genesee Community College.

GPA Requirements:

- Students must achieve a minimum recomputed GPA of 2.5 in pre-management courses and a 2.0 overall for entry into the **Business Administration** degree program.
- Students entering baccalaureate degree programs in **Engineering** must achieve a recomputed GPA overall and a 2.0 recomputed GPA in technical courses.
- Students entering baccalaureate degree programs in BioTechnology must complete pre-requirements with a 2.8 or higher
- Students entering the baccalaureate program in Social Interdisciplinary: Legal Studies must achieve a 2.0 recomputed grade point average overall. The Joint Admissions agreement will be null and void if the participant does not maintain the minimum grade point average at G.C.C.

Participants in this cooperative degree program are not required to file an application for admission to SUNY at Buffalo. However, students who anticipate enrolling at the College under the auspices of this agreement must file a Notice of Intent to Enroll with the Office of Admissions at SUNY at Buffalo prior to beginning their studies. Genesee Community College students must present a minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 for most of the baccalaureate degree programs covered by this agreement. However, students intending to transfer to the B.S. degree program in veterinary technology must earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 at GCC in order to be accepted.

Students accepted into the dual admissions program will be required to complete a formal application for admissions to Medaille College during their second year. For a fall semester start, the application must be filed no later than March 31 of the same calendar year. For a spring semester start, the application must be submitted no later than November 1 of the previous calendar year.

Students matriculating at Medaille through this agreement will be required to pay the normal transfer student enrollment deposit required at the time of entrance before receiving final clearance to attend class. Also, students who wish to reside in campus residence halls should contact the Office of Student Affairs at least five months before their expected start date for classes at Medaille. Like all Medaille students, they will be required to submit a room deposit as soon as possible or by July 15 for the Fall semester and by October 15 for the Spring semester.
