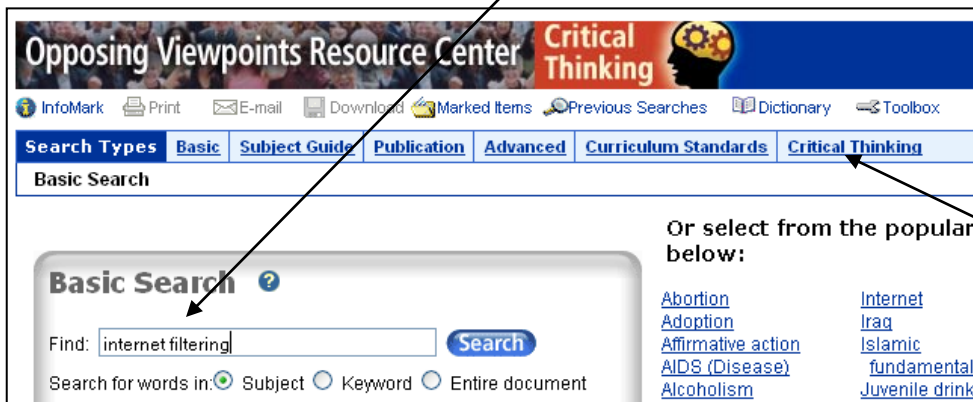
Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center (OVR) provides online access to the Opposing Viewpoints book series available in print in the GCC Library's collection. In addition to the book content, this database includes links to articles, statistics, primary documents and websites dealing with current social issues.

To Start:

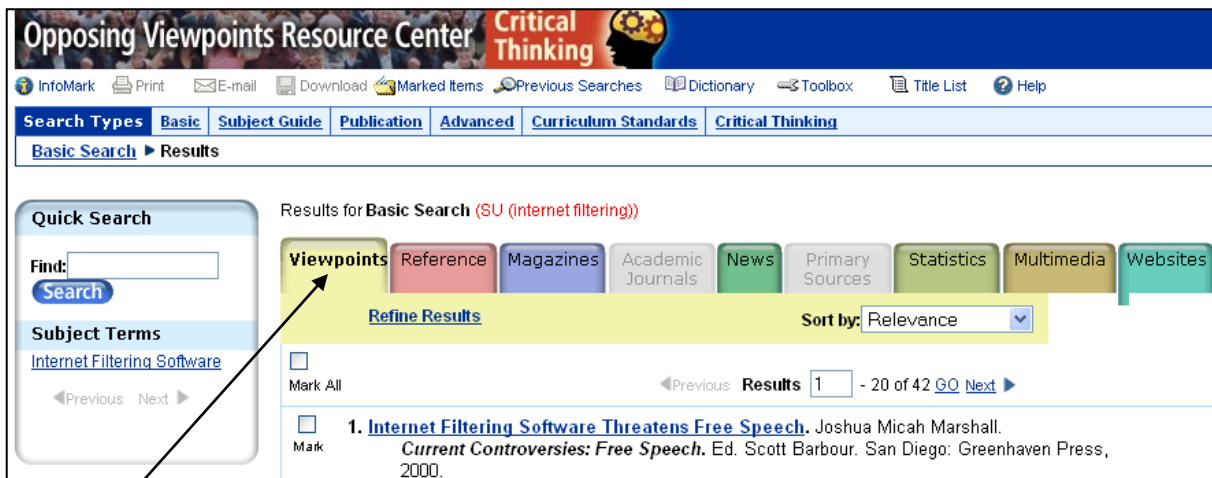
1. Go to the library web page at <http://www.genesee.edu/Library>
2. Click on **Databases A-Z**
3. Select the link for **Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center**

To Search:

1. Click on a topic from the list provided **OR**
2. Type in your search term or terms in the box under Basic Search and click on the search button.



3. You will now see the results of your search:



- Essays about the different sides of the issue will be displayed under the **Viewpoints** tab. Some of these essays are from the printed Opposing Viewpoints book series available in the library.
- The **Reference** tab leads to selections from various reference sources from Gale and Macmillan USA (publishers).
- Articles can be found under the **Magazines**, **Academic Journals**, and **News** tabs.
- Information on statistics, website links, multimedia, and primary sources can be found under the appropriate tabs.

Note: when a tab is "grayed out" the database does not have any information in that area.

To find more on the same topic:

On the left side of the screen, you will find subjects related to the words you typed in at the beginning of your search. Click on one of these to expand your search.

When you find a document you wish to print, click on the **Print** icon ( Print) on the top left side of the screen. This will reformat the document for printing. Once the document is formatted, click on **File** then **Print** at the top of the screen or use the browser print button. You can also email documents using the **Email** option.
