Compliance Statement: The Crime Awareness & Campus Security Act of 1990

Genesee Community College's Annual Security Report is available online to all current Genesee Community College students and employees, and to all prospective students and employees upon request to the Vice President of Human Resources and Planning.

The Annual Security Report includes:

- Statistics on the number of crimes in the following categories that occurred on-campus, on contiguous public property, or on non-campus locations: murder/non-negligent manslaughter, negligent manslaughter, sex offenses – forcible, sex offenses – non-forcible, robberies, aggravated assaults, burglaries, motor vehicle thefts, arsons, and bias-related crimes. Information is included about disciplinary actions and arrests for weapons possessions and liquor and drug law violations;
- Policies regarding security, access to campus facilities, and campus law enforcement;
- Procedures for reporting crimes and other emergencies;
- Information on campus sexual assault and rape awareness programs, procedures to follow when a sex offense occurs, disciplinary action procedures, counseling opportunities, and notification to students that Genesee Community College will make reasonable changes of a victim's academic situation if the victim so chooses;
- Policies on the use, possession and sale of alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs;
- A description of programs informing the campus community about alcohol and drug abuse education, crime prevention and campus security practices; and
- Sex offender registry information.
